for the payment of which, well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves, our heirs, executors, ad  
ministrators, and every of them, firmly, by these presents.

The Condition of the above Obligation is such, That, whereas  
W. L. Battie has this day made application, by petition, to the  
County Court of said county, to appoint a commissioner to view and locate a county road, called  
W. L. Battie Road.

Now, if the said road shall be established according to law, and the same become a public  
highway, in accordance with the statute in such cases made and provided, then this obligation to be  
void: otherwise, to be and remain in full force and virtue.

- We, the undersigned citizens of the County of Black Hawk in the State of Iowa, do respectfully remonstrate against the view location and as follows:
- 1<sup>o</sup> We have a road preexisting from the said Park to the said P. B. Worcester, and others to run on the section line between Sections 1<sup>o</sup>, 5<sup>o</sup> and 8<sup>o</sup> in Township No. 89 North of Range No. 13 West of the P. M. in said Black Hawks, commencing at the North line of said Township and running South on the said line half mile to the South line of said town one mile to the south line of said sections 5 & 6 to the road running on said south line.
- 2<sup>o</sup> Ours for cause of such remonstrance remonstrating that said road is not necessary for the public convenience as there is already a road laid established half a mile west across said sections, it parallel with said proposed road.
- 2<sup>o</sup> No legal notice has been given of the application for said road.
- 3<sup>o</sup> Our proposed road is less than three miles in length and no bond or security has been given (Sec. 826) for the absolute payment of all the expenses growing out of
