To the House of Representatives of the United States
Senate.

We the undersigned residents of Washington Territory, District of Columbia, and
subscribed, communicate against the allowance of
the laying out of a road through, or on the west line
of the land belonging to J. H. Hughes and J. H. Hughes,
which land was devised by father, the last 1/2 of
March and 1/4 of Oct. 20 in Washington Territory;
and we most respectfully urge on the ground of
our convenience.

Let West to day and the road on the west line
of our land be as fast as the petition; would
allow a fine score, which now is a restriction
to the freedom of our J. H. Hughes on our land
land, and also small capital and J. H. Hughes to
land about half mile of our fence.

2nd West the road would be much more con-
venient, and shorter if our road upon the
western line right road west of the line beyond
our land further on our land land.

3rd West to lay the road on western line as before
states, and not upon the line of our Hughes's line,
more benefit to those who would have such road
about mine, and is much less amount of clear-
ing necessary in the laying out of the road.
