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

Road Notes

There will be a petition presented to the Board of Supervisors of Blackstone County soon on the first Monday of January 1868 asking for the appointment of a Commission to view and report upon the expediency of vacating that portion of road called the "Cedar State Western Road" described as follows. Commencing at the Centre of Section 2nd Township 89 of Range 14 running thence in a north westerly & diagonal line well substantiated the County road, running by the Olcott place and across Ocean Brook, and also to run and repair upon the expediency of leaving out a road. Commencing at the Centre of Section 1st Township 89 of Range 14 and running thence west and half mile to westward the "Cedar Road" which runs north and south between sections 10 and 11 and 3 and 4 of Township 89 of Range 14 West.


