You are hereby notified that you have been appointed a Commissioner to view, and if expedient, to locate a county road, petitioned for by Joseph Mitchell and others, and to be called the Joseph Mitchell Road, described as follows:

Commencing at the North West corner of Section

No two (2) in Township No Eighty nine

(Sd North of Range No Twelve (12) that system)

Hence running South on Section line to

the South West corner of Section No Eleven

(11) in said Township and Range)

You will, therefore, appear at the office of some Justice of the Peace, Notary Public, or Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, and qualify according to law; and on the 14th day of June 1869, you will proceed to commence the examination of the route above described, and if, in your judgment, the above road is needed, or one in the vicinity answering the same purpose, you will call to your assistance the necessary aid, and proceed to lay out and mark the same according to law and the following instructions, and report to the Board on or before the 15th day of June 1869.

1. In your survey of a road you will particularly describe the point of commencement, with reference to some monument or record, which will be generally found to consist of corners in the public and private surveys, the exact course and distance from some one of which you must give in your field notes.
2. The point at which you terminate your survey must be ascertained and minutely reference to the same evidence as is herein required for the commencing point.
3. All letters and figures inscribed upon wood, must be cut with a "managing iron," similar to that used in the Government survey of lands.
4. When bearing trees are taken, (and it is strongly enjoined that it within ten chains of an angle, they should without fail be taken,) a smooth face fronting the angle of the road, should be made as near to the ground as practicable, and in this face should be cut the initial letters of the points of beginning and ending of the road. For example—a road from Dault to Quincy—D. & C. R. When bearing trees cannot be had at angles, it is recommended the bearing and distance to a boundary, edifice, or corner of an enclosure be taken, and where this is impracticable, a large mound of earth should be raised at the point of the angle.
5. Marks in timber will consist of a smith's "blaze," with a notch in the centre, except the trees with the line cuts, each of which must have three notches, both upon the side which the line strikes, and that upon which it leaves such trees. All the posts must be set up at every mile, and the distance marked thereon. Stakes must be set at the crossing of fences and streams, and at intervals in the prairie not exceeding one-fourth of a mile each.
6. After completing your survey of this road, you must carefully protect the same upon paper, with a view to the detection of all errors, either in your chaining or course.
7. These instructions in no way relieve you from each and every duty prescribed by the laws of Iowa Revision of 1850, pages 134 and 135.
8. All your assistants are required to be sworn by some person authorized to administer oaths.
