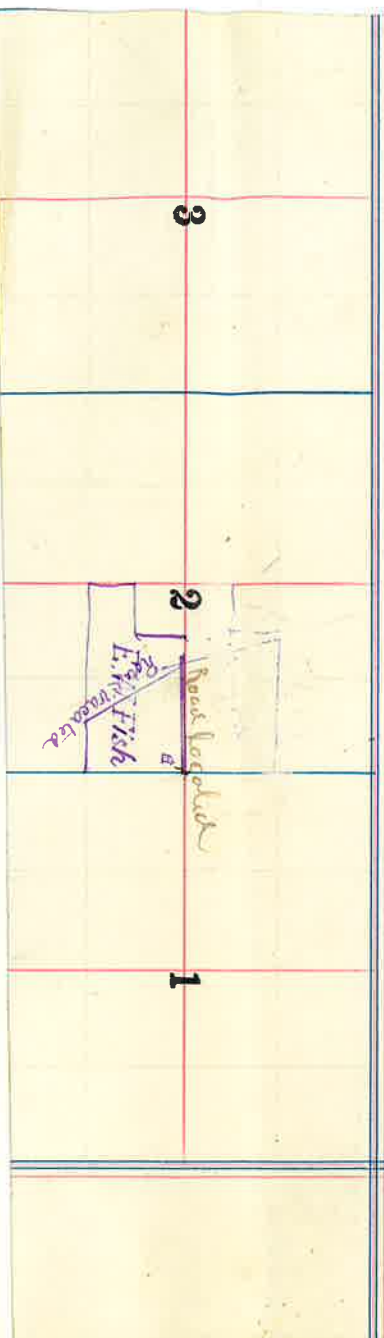

The road vacated is as follows. Commencing at a point in the Garrison Road at the point where said road crosses the center section line running east & west. (80 N (2 = 80 = 14) thence south-east through land owned by G. W. Fish) to a point 1 1/2 rods west of the 1/8 eighth corner on the section line which corner is eight rods north of the south-east corner of section two (2 = 80 = 14) thence east to said eighth corner.

The road located is as follows commencing at the quarter corner on each side of section two thence running west on center section line about one hundred rods to the point where said line reaches the old Garrison Road, said road to be fifty feet in width with the center section line for center of the road.

To the Honorable Board of Supervisors of said County :

The undersigned, having been appointed a Commissioner to view, and, if thought necessary, locate a certain Road in said County, petitioned for by

C. W. Fish

and others, and known as

the

Harrison

Road, would report as follows :

That, having been duly sworn, he found, upon examination, that it was expedient and necessary, for the accommodation of the public, that the road should be located as petitioned for. No objection being made. I would recommend that the road be made 3 1/2 ft. in width and located with the center section line running east and west for the center of the road.

Therefore, with the assistance of

as chairmen,

amen, who were all duly sworn, your Commissioner proceeded on the day set therefore, to-wit: the 28th day of June A. D. 1870, to lay out and locate said Road, and to distinguish the same by the proper marks, mounds, and stakes, in the manner prescribed by law, and in accordance with the Field Notes and Plat of Survey of the Road, which are herewith annexed, and which are made part of this report.

Your Commissioner is of the opinion, that the road will be of great convenience and utility to the public, and would hereby recommend its establishment.

Also to make that part of said Garrison Street running through the land now owned & occupied by E. M. Fols in said townships & County.

and the following instructions, and report to the Board on or before the 21st day of *April* 1870.

1. In your survey of this road you will particularly describe the point of commencement, with reference to some monument record, which will be generally found to consist of corners in the public and private surveys; (the exact course and distance from some one of which you must give in your field notes).
2. The point at which you terminate your survey must be ascertained and returned by reference to the same evidence as is herein required for the commencing point.
3. All letters and figures inscribed upon your survey must be cut with a 'snapping iron,' similar to that used in the Government survey of a road, and the letters should be made as near like the ground as practicable, and in this first letters of the points of beginning and ending of the road. For example—a road from Delhi to Colony—D & C. R. When locating trees cannot be had at angles, it is recommended the bearing and distance to a boundary, edifice, or corner of an enclosure be taken, and where this is impracticable, a large mound of earth should be raised at the point of the angle.
5. Marks in timber will consist of a snath, 'blaze,' with a notch in the centre, except the trees with the line cuts, each of which must have three notches, both upon the side which the line strikes, and that upon which it leaves such trees. Mile posts must be set up at every mile, and the distance marked thereon. Stakes must be set at the crossing of fences and streams, and at intervals in the prairie not exceeding one-fourth of a mile each.
6. After completing your survey of this road, you must carefully protect the same upon paper, with a view to the detection of all errors, either in your chaining or course.
7. These instructions in no way relieve you from each and every duty prescribed by the laws of Iowa Revision of 1860, pages 134 and 135.
8. All your assistants are required to be sworn by some person authorized to administer oaths.
