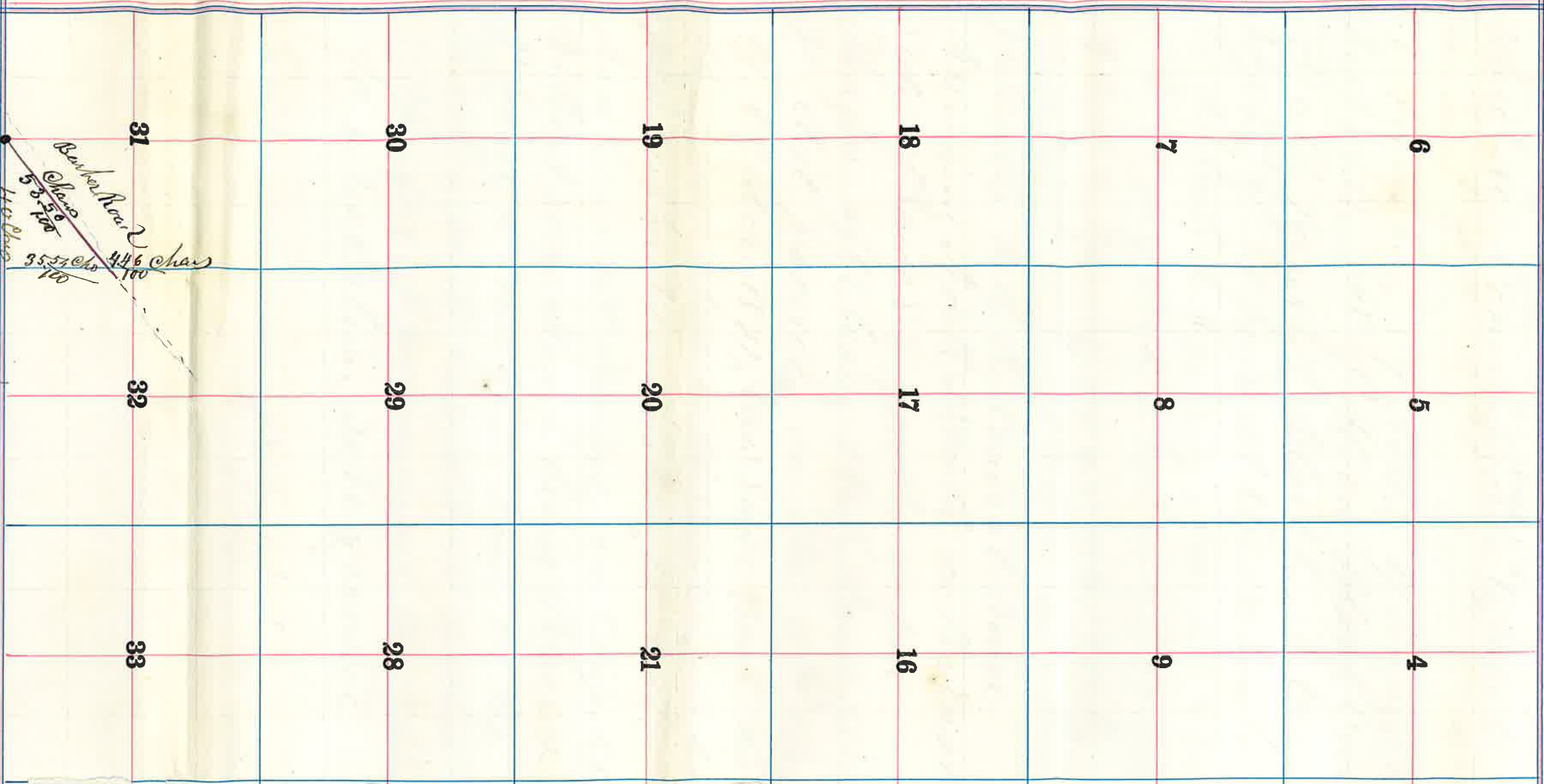

Commencing at ~~the~~ or near the the South West corner of the South East quarter of Section 16 thirty one (31) in Township 1st Eighth Range 10th Fourth (14) West of the 5th E. 1st N. thence along said road in a North Easterly direction to a point where said road intersects with the Central Road running North and South on the East side of said South East quarter. See 31 1889 Range 14.

You will, therefore, appear before some officer authorized to administer oaths in and for said county, and qualify according to law; and on the 11th day of October 1871, you will proceed to commence ^{the} examination of the route above described, and if, in your judgment, the above road is needed, or one in the vicinity answering the same purpose, you will call to your assistance the necessary aid, and proceed to lay out and make the same according to law and the following instructions, and report to the Board on or before the 18th day of October 1871.

1. In your survey of this road you will particularly describe the point of commencement, with reference to some monument record, which will be generally found to consist of corners in the public and private surveys; the exact course and distance from some one of which you must give in your field notes.
2. The point at which you terminate your survey must be ascertained and returned by reference to the same evidence as is herein required for the commencing point.
3. All letters and figures inscribed upon wood, must be cut with a "pinking iron," similar to that used in the Government survey of lands.
4. Where bearing trees are taken, (and it is strongly enjoined that if within ten chains of an angle they should without fail be taken,) a smooth face fronting the angle of the road, should be made as near the ground as practicable, and in this face should be cut the initial letters of the points of beginning and ending of the road. For example:—a road from Delhi to Colony—D. & C. R. When bearings are taken, the points of beginning and ending of the road should be marked with a boulder, or corner of an enclosure be taken, and where this is impracticable, a spot of ground or earth should be raised at the point of the angle.
5. Marks in timber will consist of a smooth "blaze," with a notch in the centre, except the spot marked with the line ends, each of which must have three notches, both upon the side which the line strikes, and that upon which it leaves such trees. All posts must be set up at every mile, and the distance marked thereon. Stakes must be set at the crossing of fences and streams, and at intervals in the public not exceeding the distance marked thereon.
6. After completing your survey of this road, you must carefully protect the same upon paper, with a view to the detection of all errors, either in your chaining or course.
7. These instructions in no way relieve you from each and every duty prescribed by the laws of Iowa Revision of 1860, pages 124 and 135.
8. All your assistants are required to be sworn by some person authorized to administer oaths.
