ROAD NOTICE.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That a petition will be presented to the Board
of Supervisors of Blackhawk County, Iowa, on the 27th day of
July A. D. 1872 for the appointment of a Commissioner to examine

into the expediency of establishing a County Road on the following route, and to report
accordingly, to-wit: Commencing at two and one half feet front of the
Center of Section 10 Township 42N Range 40E Quarter (14) in Township 40
Eighty min (89) North Range 40E Quarter (14) West, thence
East 121 Rods thence South 2 1/2 feet thence East 8 rods
of Section 10 Quarter in Township Eighty min (89)
Range Thirtieth, thence North 40 Rods, thence East (89) Rods
thence North to Cedar Rapids & Cedar Falls State Road,
Said Road 4 1/2 feet wide from front of commencement
East 121 Rods, and from thence to termination 4 1/2 feet wide

You are hereby notified that you have been appointed a Commissioner to view, and if expedient to locate a county road as petitioned by J. Barker and others, and to be called the Barker

Road, described as follows:

Commencing ~~at the~~ 2 1/2 feet north of the center of Section No 24 in Twp of No 89 North of Range No 14 West of the 3rd Mer. - thence ^{running} East 121 rods - thence South 2 1/2 feet - thence East to the center of Section No 19 in Twp of No 89 North of Range No 13 & thence North 40 rods - thence East 80 rods - thence North to intersect the Cedar Rapids & Cedar Falls Road, said Road to be 45 feet wide from the point of Commencement East 121 rods. And from thence to the termination of said road to be 30 feet wide

You will, therefore, appear before some officer authorized to administer oaths in and for said county, and qualify according to law; and on the 27th day of August 1872, you will proceed to commence the examination of the route above described, and if, in your judgment, the above road is needed, or one in the vicinity answering the same purpose, you will call to your assistance the necessary aid, and proceed to lay out and mark the same according to law and the following instructions, and report to the Board on or before the 31st day of August 1872.

1. In your survey of this road you will particularly describe the point of commencement, with reference to some monument record, which will be generally found to consist of corners in the public and private surveys; the exact course and distance from some one of which you must give in your field notes.
2. The point at which you terminate your survey must be ascertained and returned by reference to the same evidence as is herein required for the commencing point.
3. All letters and figures inscribed upon wood, must be cut with a "marking iron," similar to that used in the Government survey of lands.
4. Where bearing trees are taken, (and it is strongly enjoined that if within ten chains of an angle they should without fail be taken,) a smooth face fronting the angle of the road, should be made as near the ground as practicable, and in this face should be cut the initial letters of the points of beginning and ending of the road. For example:—a road from Delhi to Colony—D. & C. R. When bearing trees cannot be had at angles, it is recommended the bearing and distance to a boulder, cliff, or corner of an enclosure be taken, and where this is impracticable, a large mound of earth should be raised at the point of the angle.
5. Marks in timber will consist of a smith "blaze," with a notch in the center, except the trees with the line cuts, each of which must have three notches, both upon the side with the line strikes, and that upon which it leaves such trees. All posts must be set up at every mile, and the distance marked thereon.—stakes must be set at the crossing of fences and streams, and at intervals in the prairie not exceeding one-fourth of a mile each.
6. After completing your survey of this road, you must carefully protect the same upon paper, with a view to the detection of all errors, either in your chaining or course.
7. These instructions in no way relieve you from each and every duty prescribed by the laws of Iowa Revision of 1860, pages 134 and 135.
8. All your assistants are required to be sworn by some person authorized to administer oaths.
