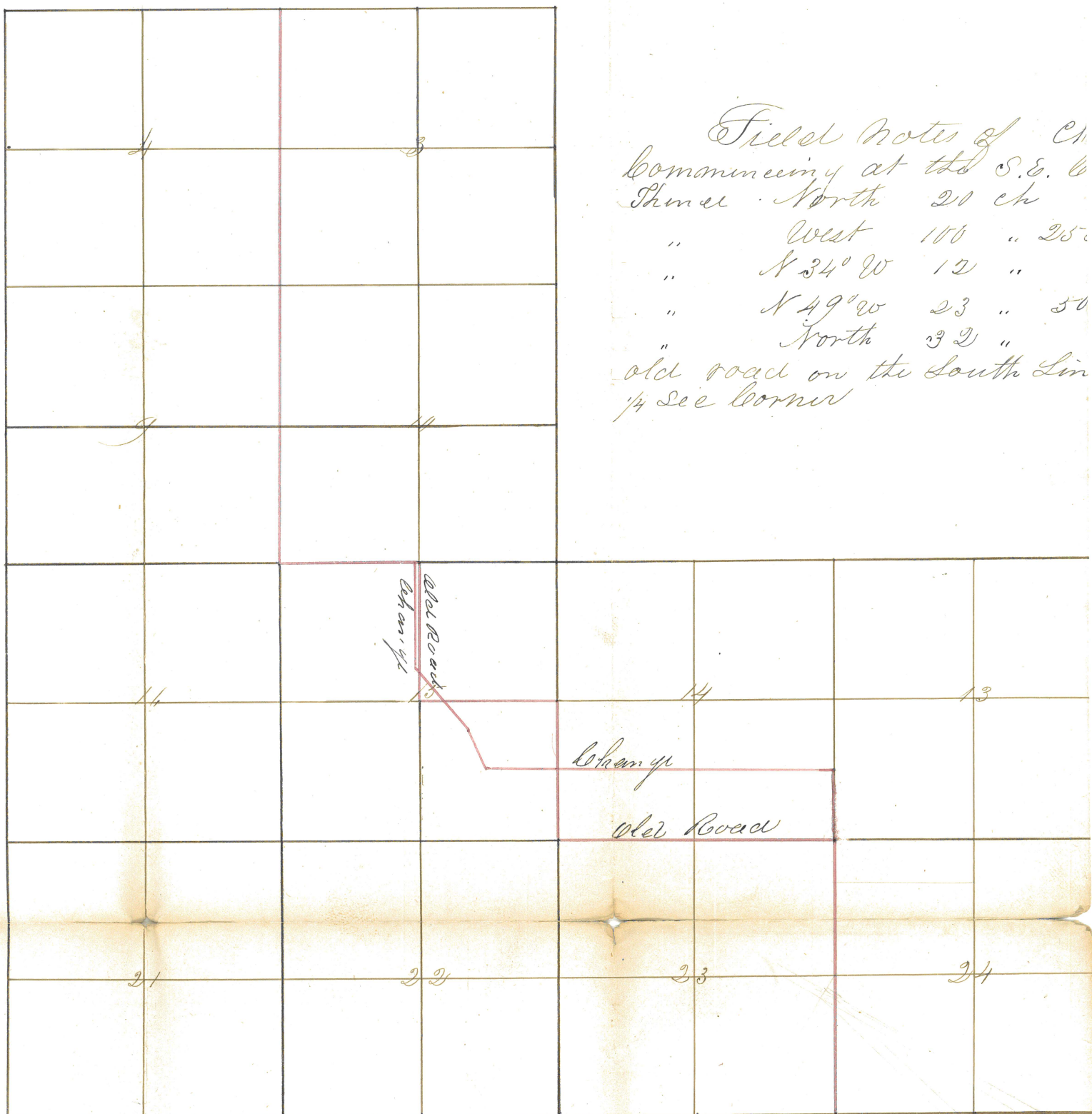

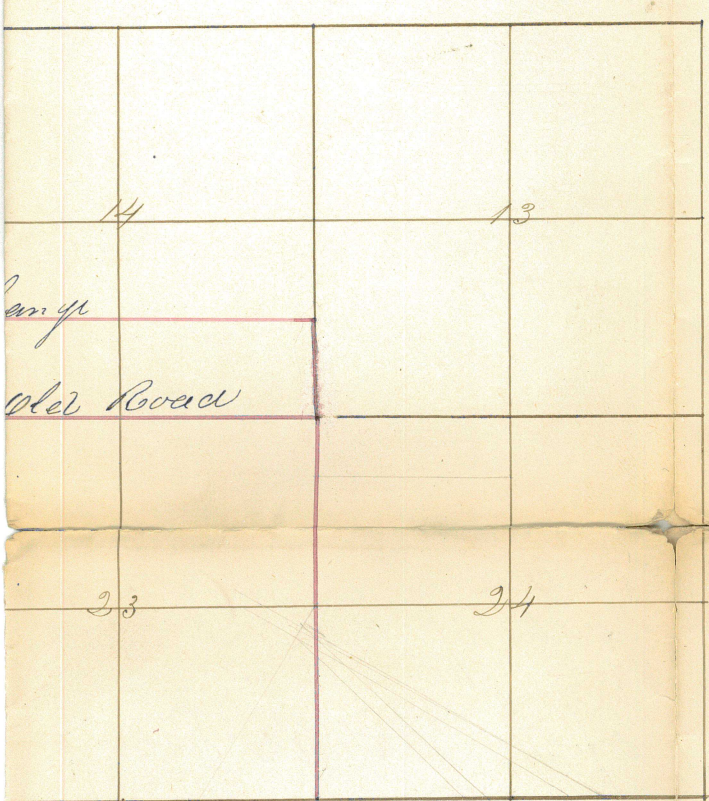

Notice is hereby given, to all whom it may concern, That the following roads in Blackhawk County, in the State of Iowa, to-wit:

The road leading from the N. E. corner of Section 23 to the N. E. corner of Section 2, in Township 89, Range 13, originally petitioned for by Martin Bailey, and known as the Waterloo and Messenger Road;

The Road petitioned for by Stephen Evans and others, and known as the Spring Creek and County Line Road, commencing at the east line of the County, at the 1-4 post on Section 25, Township 87, Range 11, and ending on the South line of said County, one mile South of the mouth of Spring Creek;

The Road petitioned for by N. W. Tottingham and others, and known as the first division of the Waterloo and Big Woods Road, commencing at the S.
