The undersigned, having been appointed a Commissioner to view, and, if thought necessary, to locate a certain Road in said County, all petitioned for by

H. P. Allen and others, and known as the Fairview

Cemetery

Road, would report as follows:

That, having been duly sworn, he found, upon examination, that it was  
expeditious and necessary for the accommodation of the public, that the road should be established  
in the Franklin Creek Valley, being located with from point of Commencement to junction  
as petitioned for. Of rocky stone, eight feet long and six inches thick. Distance 66 ft.  
wide to curve at South East corner of Cemetery and then back to junction of old highway.  
Therefore with the assistance of

Ed. Faussevert and Wm. H. Butoras chainmen,

axmen, who were all duly sworn, your Commissioner proceeded on the day set therefor, to-wit: the 1<sup>st</sup> day of June

A. D. 1871, to lay out and locate said Road, and to distinguish the same by the proper marks, mounds and stakes, in the manner prescribed by law, and in accordance with the Field Notes and Plat of Survey of the Road, which are hereunto annexed, and which are made part of this report.

Your Commissioner is of the opinion, that the road will be of great convenience and utility to the public, and would hereby recommend its location.



You are hereby notified that you have been appointed a Commissioner to view, and if expedient to locate county road, as petitioned by

H. C. Moore and others, and to be called the Harvest Cemetery Road, described as follows:

Commencing at the point where the Elmwood Cemetery Rail road crosses the Jefferson City road in the City of Malta - then running North to the Malta Cemetery on the extreme Cedar River - thence North to the Malta & Cedar Valley Railroad.

Carrying at the Northern corner of Franklin Street in the City of Malta - then in a Northwesterly direction to the Same Cemetery - thence due North to the Malta & Cedar Valley Railroad.

Given

Chain Road to the fifty (50) feet wide

You will, therefore, appear before some officer authorized to administer oaths in and for said county, and qualify according to law; and on the 1<sup>st</sup> June, day of June, 1887, you will proceed to commence the examination of the route above described, and if, in your judgment, the above road is needed, or one in the vicinity answering the same purpose, you will call to your assistance the necessary aid, and proceed to lay out and mark the same according to law and the following instructions, and report to the Board of Supervisors on or before the 1<sup>st</sup> July, 1887.

1. In your survey of this road you will particularly describe the point of commencement, with reference to some monument record, which will be generally found to consist of corners in the public and private surveys; the exact course and distance from some one of which you must give in your field notes, required for the connecting point.

2. The point at which you terminate your survey must be ascertained and returned by reference to the same evidence as is herein required for the connecting point.

3. All letters and figures inscribed upon wood, must be cut with a "marking iron," similar to that used in the Government survey of lands.

4. When bearing trees are taken, and it is strongly enjoined that if within ten chains of an angle they should without fail be taken, a smooth face fronting the angle of the road, should be made in the ground as practicable, and in this face should be cut the initial letters of the points of beginning and ending of the road. For example—Road from Denton to Colony—D & C. When bearing trees cannot be had at angles, it is recommended that the bearing and distance to a boulder, drift, or corner of an enclosure be taken, and where this is impracticable, a large mound of earth should be raised at the point of the angle.

5. Marks in timber will consist of a small "brace" with a notch in the center, except the trees with the line cuts, each of which must have three notches, both upon the side which the line strikes, and that upon which it leaves such trees. Mile posts must be set up at every mile and the distances marked thereon, stakes must be set at the crossing of fences and streams, and at intervals in the prairie not exceeding one-fourth of a mile each.

6. After completing your survey of this road, you must carefully probate the same upon paper, with a view to the detection of all errors, either in your chaining or compass.

7. These instructions in no way relieve you from each and every duty prescribed by the laws of Iowa Revision of 1880, pages 134 and 135.

8. All your assistants are required to be sworn by some person authorized to administer oaths.




Ridge extending NE & SE it.




