You are hereby notified, that you have been appointed a Commissioner to view, and if required, to view a County Road, petitioned for by Per. John Nemmers and others, and described as follows:

Commencing at Church street between Blocks nos 72 and seventy three "73" in Guilfordville Iowa and running thence to First street, and commencing at Kimman street and running to Fulton street between Blocks numbers 72 and 73. All of the above being located in the Village of Guilfordville Blackhawk county, Iowa

~~and terminating at~~

You will therefore appear at the office of some Justice of the Peace, Notary Public, or other proper officer and qualify according to law, and on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of November A. D. 1904 you will proceed to make an examination of the route above described. If, in your judgment, the above road is needed, or one in the vicinity of the route described, answering the same purpose, you may call to your assistance the necessary aid, and each being duly sworn, cause said line to be accurately surveyed and plainly marked out.

You will connect your starting point with the nearest section corner or quarter post. When, however, there is a corner of a forty established in a permanent manner, more convenient, you may connect with it. In crossing a section line, NOTE that fact, and state the distance from the nearest section corner or quarter post. The plat of the survey to accompany the field notes should be on the scale of forty chains to the inch, with the section crossed by the survey laid off upon the like scale, and correctly numbered as per United States survey. Also, note all natural or artificial monuments or conspicuous objects, and the junction of streams. Also, report the number of bridges required, if any, and the probable cost thereof, on the proposed highway, as required by Chap. 80, Laws 19th General Assembly. A strict compliance with these requirements is necessary, in order to establish a uniformity in the practice, and to enable the Clerk to correctly transcribe them for record.

You will report your proceedings, together with a correct plat of the proposed Road to this office on or before the 16<sup>th</sup> day of November A. D. 1904.

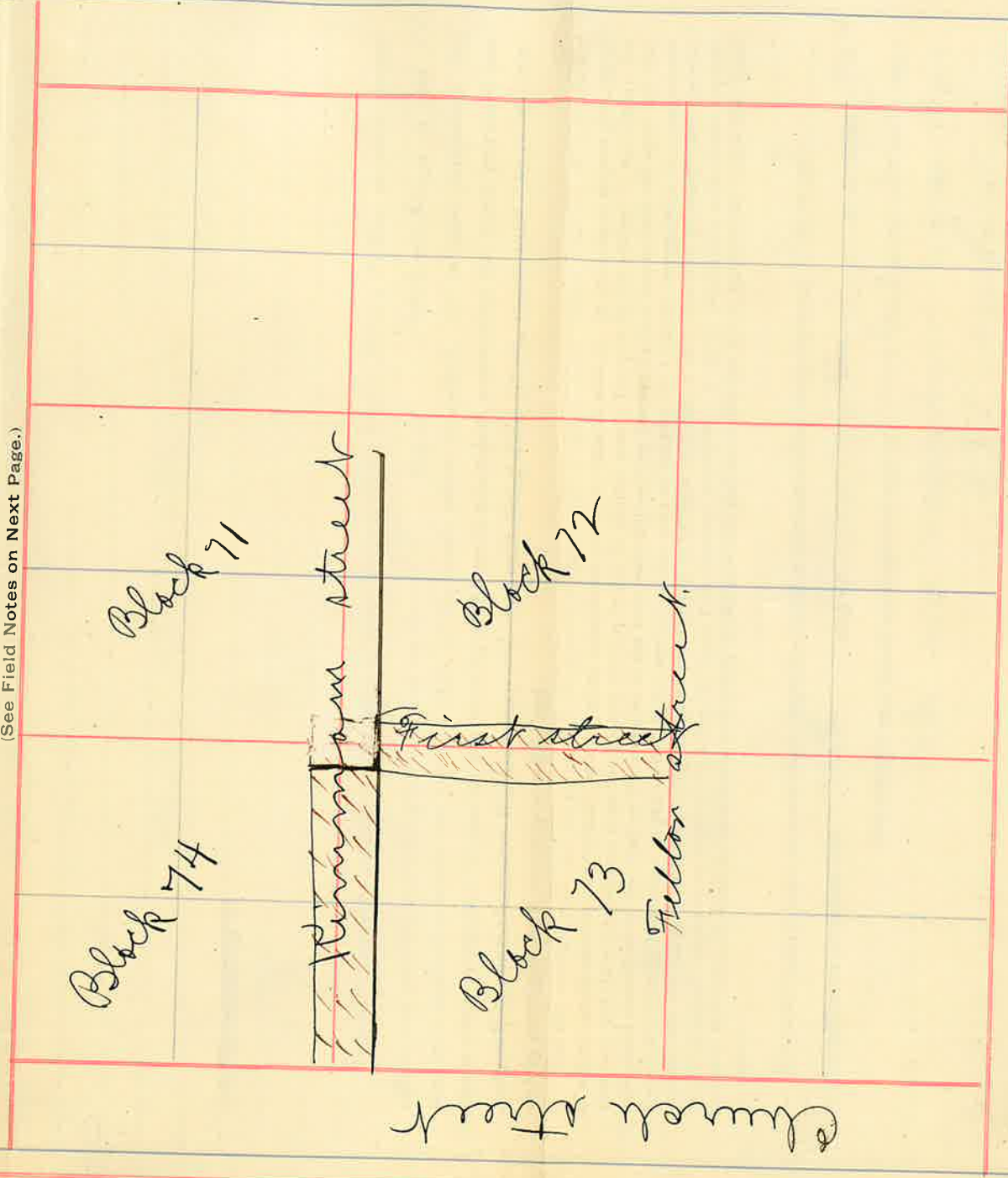

Comes now ~~the~~ undersigned your petitioners and respectfully asks the following:-

That a portion of certain highways now existing in a certain plat of the Village of Gilbertsville, Blackhawk County, Iowa. described as follows:-

That part of Kinnam Street extending from Church Street to First Street and that portion of First Street extending from Felton Street to Kinnam Street be vacated. ~~And~~ the title of the same vested in adjacent owners.

Your petitioners further state:- That they are the owners in fee simple of all the property adjacent thereto and to be affected by said vacation .

And we and each of us do hereby relinquish all claims for damages by reason of said vacation .

Your petitioners further State: That said portions of the highway have not been used as a highway for more than Twenty Years last passed.

That said adjacent property is owned by the Catholic Church and used in connection with the Church in said Village. That a part of said property is now used as a burying-ground and that portion now used as such has been entirely exhausted and they desire to extend said burying-ground to include portions of Block No 72 and 74. and desire said portion of said Streets vacated in order that said burying-ground will be included in one un-divided tract of land. 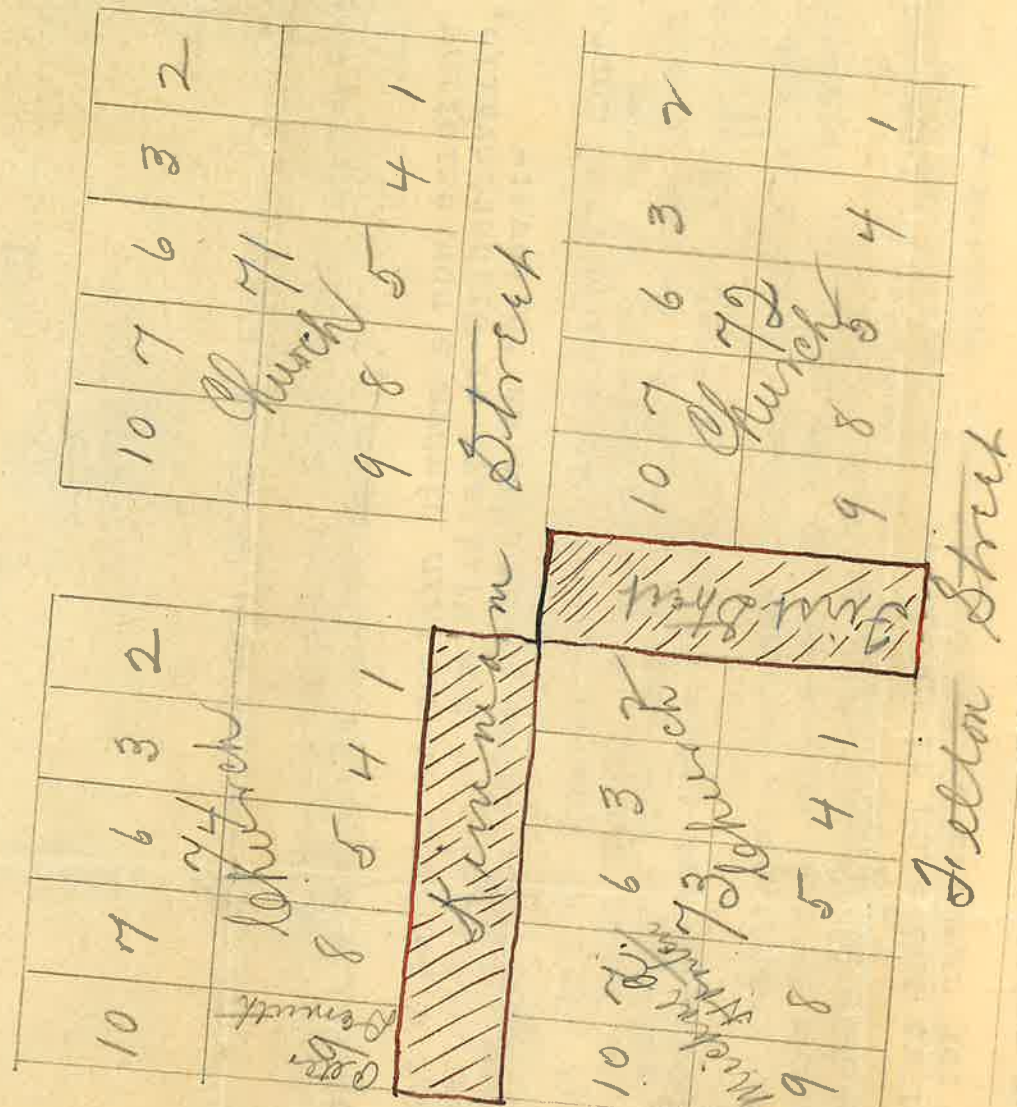
