The Board of Supervisors of the County of Black Hawk, in the State of Iowa, met in regular adjourned meeting at the Court House, in Waterloo, to the rules of said County, at nine o'clock (9:00) a.m., pursuant to law, to order, and on roll call there were present: Chairman, Clark Lichty, Wm. J. Beck, Carl R. Davis, Vincent Driscoll Sr. and Donald Sage.

Absent: None

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Mr. Beck presented the following resolution and moved its adoption, seconded by Mr. Driscoll:

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Black Hawk County, that that part of Belle Street in Sec. 7-88-12 described as Black Hawk County:

Beginning at a point on the East line of the West 31 rods of Lot 4, 477.9 feet North of the South line of said Lot 4, said point being the Northeast corner of Belle Street as platted in "Closson Subdivision in Black Hawk County, Iowa"; thence East at right angles to the East line of said West 31 rods a distance of 300 feet; thence South parallel to said East line a distance of 60 feet; thence West to a point on the East line of said West 31 rods which is 417.9 feet North of the South line of said Lot 4; thence North along the East line of the West 31 rods of said Lot 4 a distance of 60 feet to the point of beginning.
